MEASURES TO CURB CORRUPT PRACTICES REGARDING BLOOD DONATION IN MAIN BLOOD BANK AIIMS

- 1. No donors are accepted as replacement donor for a patient if not carrying valid ID proof of himself/herself and proper donor slip from the doctor.
- 2. All donors will be asked for photograph and biometric capture before registration.
- 3. All documentation is computerised for fast and easy recovery of data.
- 4. Donors have to fill a detailed donor questionnaire with option of self deferral.
- 5. Pre donation counselling is done by NACO trained counsellors. High risk behaviour is tactically elucidated by the counsellor. Donors with high risk behaviour are discouraged/ deferred from donation.
- 6. All donors undergo complete physical and systemic examination by doctors before donation. Only if found fit they will be allowed to donate.
- 7. Any donor found to be suspicious is interrogated to find the truth and if found to be a paid donor is handed over to the hospital security with complete documentation.
- 8. Continuous monitoring with help of CCTV is done.
- 9. Security guard is on duty during donation hours. He helps in reducing crowding.
- 10. Notice, warning patients to not enter into any financial transaction for blood/ components are displayed at strategic places in and around main blood bank premises.
- 11. MSSO and CMO are always available to help patients in need of blood.
- 12. Blood bank staff is trained regarding D&C Act rules and are taught to be vigilant at all times as the blood bank runs 24x7.
