

## Bid Corrigendum

Following terms and conditions supersede all existing "Buyer added Bid Specific Terms and conditions" given in the bid document or any previous corrigendum. Prospective bidders are advised to bid as per following Terms and Conditions:

### Buyer Added Bid Specific Additional Terms and Conditions

1. Experience Certificate for the supply of the same to any Govt/ PSU/ any renowned private organisation along with Supply/ Purchase Order.
2. If the agency is registered under MSME or NSIC, then EMD exemption certificate needs to be enclosed.

4. Bidders shall quote only those products (Part of Service delivery) in the bid which are not obsolete in the market and has at least 7 years residual market life i.e. the offered product shall not be declared end-of-life by the OEM before this period.
5. Bidders are advised to check applicable GST on their own before quoting. Buyer will not take any responsibility in this regards. GST reimbursement will be as per actuals or as per applicable rates (whichever is lower), subject to the maximum of quoted GST %.
6. Data Sheet of the product(s) offered in the bid, are to be uploaded along with the bid documents. Buyers can match and verify the Data Sheet with the product specifications offered. In case of any unexplained mismatch of technical parameters, the bid is liable for rejection.
7. Malicious Code Certificate:  
  
The seller should upload following certificate in the bid:-  
(a) This is to certify that the Hardware and the Software being offered, as part of the contract, does not contain Embedded Malicious code that would activate procedures to :-  
(i) Inhibit the desires and designed function of the equipment.  
(ii) Cause physical damage to the user or equipment during the exploitation.  
(iii) Tap information resident or transient in the equipment/network.  
(b) The firm will be considered to be in breach of the procurement contract, in case physical damage, loss of information or infringements related to copyright and Intellectual Property Right (IPRs) are caused due to activation of any such malicious code in embedded software.
8. **Manufacturer Authorization:**Wherever Authorised Distributors/service providers are submitting the bid, Authorisation Form /Certificate with OEM/Original Service Provider details such as name, designation, address, e-mail Id and Phone No. required to be furnished along with the bid
9. **OPTION CLAUSE:** The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 50 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. The purchaser also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity by up to 50% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at the contracted rates. Bidders are bound to accept the orders accordingly.
10. Products supplied shall be nontoxic and harmless to health. In the case of toxic materials, Material Safety Data Sheet may be furnished along with the material.

12. The Buyer has an existing set up / inventory of similar products. The offered / supplied product must be compatible with existing system. The bidder has to ensure Compatibility of the supplied items or shall have to include in the supply the necessary hardware / software to make them compatible at no extra cost to the buyer. The details of items with which compatibility is required are as under:  
The quoted equipment must carry Comprehensive warranty for Five years (Including all parts, spares, accessories, all third party items e.g. cables, plastic items etc. and labour) from the date of satisfactory Installation of equipment. All software updates for a period of 10 years to be provided free of cost
13. The successful bidder has to supply all essential accessories required for the successful installation and commissioning of the goods supplied. Besides standard accessories as per normal industry practice, following accessories must be part of supply and cost should be included in bid price:

15. IMPORTED PRODUCTS: In case of imported products, OEM or Authorized Seller of OEM should have a registered office in India to provide after sales service support in India. The certificate to this effect should be submitted.

20. Successful Bidder can submit the Performance Security in the form of Fixed Deposit Receipt also (besides PBG which is allowed as per GeM GTC). FDR should be made out or pledged in the name of

A/C (Name of the Seller). The bank should certify on it that the deposit can be withdrawn only on the demand or with the sanction of the pledgee. For release of Security Deposit, the FDR will be released in favour of bidder by the Buyer after making endorsement on the back of the FDR duly signed and stamped along with covering letter. Successful Bidder has to upload scanned copy of the FDR document in place of PBG and has to ensure delivery of hard copy of Original FDR to the Buyer within 15 days of award of contract.

21. Scope of supply (Bid price to include all cost components) : Supply Installation Testing and Commissioning of Goods
22. Purchase preference to Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs): Purchase preference will be given to MSEs as defined in Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 dated 23.03.2012 issued by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Ministry. If the bidder wants to avail the Purchase preference, the bidder must be the manufacturer of the offered product in case of bid for supply of goods. Traders are excluded from the purview of Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises. In respect of bid for Services, the bidder must be the Service provider of the offered Service. Relevant documentary evidence in this regard shall be uploaded along with the bid in respect of the offered product or service. If L-1 is not an MSE and MSE Seller (s) has/have quoted price within L-1+ 15% of margin of purchase preference /price band defined in relevant policy, such Seller shall be given opportunity to match L-1 price and contract will be awarded for percentage of 15% of total value.

23. Purchase Preference linked with Local Content (PP-LC) Policy:

The bid clause regarding "Preference to Make In India products" stands modified in this bid and shall be governed by the PPLC Policy No. FP-20013/2/2017-FP-PNG dated 17.11.2020 issued by MoP&NG as amended up to date. Accordingly, bidders with Local Content less than or equal to 20% will be treated as "Non Local Supplier". The prescribed LC shall be applicable on the date of Bid opening. Sanctions on the bidders for false / wrong declaration or not fulfilling the Local Content requirement shall be as per the PPLC policy. Further following additional provisions are added in the certification and verification of local content provision of the Preference to Make in India clause:

- i. In case of foreign bidder, certificate from the statutory auditor or cost auditor of their own office or subsidiary in India giving the percentage of local content is also acceptable. In case office or subsidiary in India does not exist or Indian office/subsidiary is not required to appoint statutory auditor or cost auditor, certificate from practicing cost accountant or practicing chartered accountant giving the percentage of local content is also acceptable.
- ii. Along with Each Invoice: The local content certificate (issued by statutory auditor on behalf of procuring company) shall be submitted along with each invoice raised. However, the % of local content may vary with each invoice while maintaining the overall % of local content for the total work/purchase of the pro-rata local content requirement. 25. Bidder's offer is liable to be rejected if they don't upload any of the certificates / documents sought in the

Bid document, ATC and Corrigendum if any.

26. ISO 9001: The bidder or the OEM of the offered products must have ISO 9001 certification.
27. Material Test Certificate Should Be Sent Along with The Supply. The Material Will Be Checked by Buyer's Lab & the Results of the Lab will be the Sole Criteria for Acceptance of the Item.
28. The bidder is required to upload, along with the bid, all relevant certificates such as BIS licence, type test certificate, approval certificates and other certificates as prescribed in the Product Specification given in the bid document.
29. To be eligible for award of contract, Bidder / OEM must possess following Certificates / Test Reports on the date of bid opening (to be uploaded with bid):

31. Bidder Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the bidder during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the bidder is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria.
32. OEM Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the OEM of the offered product during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the OEM is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria. In case of bunch bids, the OEM of CATEGORY RELATED TO primary product having highest bid value should meet this criterion.
33. Availability of Service Centres: Bidder/OEM must have a Functional Service Centre in the State of each Consignee's Location in case of carry-in warranty. (Not applicable in case of goods having on-site warranty). If service center is not already there at the time of bidding, successful bidder / OEM shall have to establish one within 30 days of award of contract. Payment shall be released only after submission of documentary evidence of having Functional Service Centre.
34. Dedicated /toll Free Telephone No. for Service Support : BIDDER/OEM must have Dedicated/toll Free Telephone No. for Service Support.
35. Escalation Matrix For Service Support : Bidder/OEM must provide Escalation Matrix of Telephone Numbers for Service Support.
36. Bidder / OEM has to give an undertaking that after expiry of warranty period, it will provide Comprehensive Maintenance Service for next 5 years for the offered products at the rate not more than 4 % of contract price per annum. Buyer reserves the right to enter into a CMC agreement with the Successful Bidder / OEM after expiry of the Warranty period at above mentioned rate and the payment for the CMC charges would be made Biannually after rendering of the CMC Services of the relevant CMC period. Performance Security of the successful bidder shall be forfeited if it fails to accept the CMC contract when called upon by the buyer. CMC would include cost of 4% of cost of equipment.  
(Upload the undertaking). The original Performance Security of contract will be returned only after submission and verification of AMC Performance Security for 5% of total CMC value valid up to CMC period plus 2 months (if there is no other claim).
37. Warranty period of the supplied products shall be 5 years from the date of final acceptance of goods or after completion of installation, commissioning & testing of goods (if included in the scope of supply), at consignee location. OEM Warranty certificates must be submitted by Successful Bidder at the time of delivery of Goods. The seller should guarantee the rectification of goods in case of any break down during the guarantee period. Seller should have well established Installation, Commissioning, Training, Troubleshooting and Maintenance Service group in INDIA for attending the after sales service. Details of Service Centres near consignee destinations are to be uploaded along with the bid.
38. Over and above the normal Warranty terms as per GeM GTC, the successful bidder / OEM shall have to provide Comprehensive Warranty during the entire Standard warranty period as per contract. : The comprehensive warranty shall be covering the following scope  
(Including Complete equipment, all parts, spares, accessories, all third party items e.g. cables, plastic items etc. and labour) from the date of satisfactory Installation of equipment. All software updates for a period of 10 years to be provided free of cost  
(Upload an undertaking with the bid confirming compliance by the bidder if Bidder is taking onus of this

compliance. In case OEM is taking onus of this compliance, OEM undertaking is to be uploaded along with Bidder undertaking)

39. Successful bidder will have to ensure that adequate number of dedicated technical service personals / engineers are designated / deployed for attending to the Service Request in a time bound manner and for ensuring Timely Servicing / rectification of defects during warranty period, as per Service level agreement indicated in the relevant clause of the bid.
40. Timely Servicing / rectification of defects during warranty period: After having been notified of the defects / service requirement during warranty period, Seller has to complete the required Service / Rectification within 3 days time limit. If the Seller fails to complete service / rectification with defined time limit, a penalty of 0.5% of Unit Price of the product shall be charged as penalty for each week of delay from the seller. Seller can deposit the penalty with the Buyer directly else the Buyer shall have a right to recover all such penalty amount from the Performance Security (PBG). Cumulative Penalty cannot exceed more than 10% of the total contract value after which the Buyer shall have the right to get the service / rectification done from alternate sources at the risk and cost of the Seller besides forfeiture of PBG. Seller shall be liable to re-imburse the cost of such service / rectification to the Buyer.

#### 2. REVISED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS (AFTER PRE-BID MEETING)

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The Blood Gas Analyzer along with UPS is to be provided of below mention ed specifications. The equipment should be approved by appropriate certif ications and certificates must be provided.

1. The blood gas analyzer should be of fully automatic and NOT based on cartridge system.
2. It should be of high quality with ability to measure samples quickly and with utmost accuracy.
3. Results should be available within one minute of inserting sample in the machine.
4. The time taken for the machine to be ready to analyze next sample should be less than one minute.
5. The machine should be able to analyze blood gas with as low as 500micro liter of blood.
6. The equipment must capable to measure the following parameters & should be available as a final result: PH; Pao<sub>2</sub>; PCO<sub>2</sub>; Bicarbonate ion (HCO<sub>3</sub><sup>-</sup>); Base excess (BE); Total content of CO<sub>2</sub> (**TCO<sub>2</sub>**); Sodium ion (Na<sup>+</sup>); Potassium ion (K<sup>+</sup>); Ionized Ca<sup>2+</sup>; Chloride ion (Cl<sup>-</sup>); Anion gap; Glucose; Lactate; SO<sub>2</sub>%; Hematocrit (Hct); Hemoglobin (Hb) and Serum **Osmolality**.
7. Machine should be equipped with automated internal quality control.
8. Equipment should undergo auto calibration at frequent intervals to ensure accurate assessment of gas values. A provision to start calibration manually should also be present.
9. The machine should work at a power input of 180-240 V, 50 Hz AC supply.
10. ABG printout from the inbuilt printer.
11. There should be a provision to enter the demographic data of each sample.

**Essential clause:**

1. The vendor should ensure 24 X 7 service help for the machines and any complaint should be resolved within 8 hours of complaint. If any complaint is not resolved within the specified time period the same should be conveyed to the user department in writing with valid reasons mentioned.
2. Firm must provide the printing paper, electrodes, software updates and periodic calibration within the quoted prices (at free of cost, during warranty & CAMC period).
3. In case of non repair of the equipment within 24 hours of the complaint, the vendor should replace the non-functioning equipment with a similar or higher model otherwise the vendor shall be liable to pay a penalty of Rs.5,000/- per day. This will be applicable on holidays as well. No request in this regard will be entertained on the pretext of non availability of items with supplier/company.

4. Onsite demonstration of equipment and its all features is must for technically qualification of the instrument.
5. **Warranty:** The quoted equipment must carry Comprehensive warranty for Five years (Including all parts, spares, accessories, all third party items e.g. cables, plastic items etc. and labour) from the date of satisfactory Installation of equipment. All software updates for a period of 10 years to be provided free of cost.
6. **CAMC:** The bidder must quote rates for Comprehensive Annual Maintenance Contract (CAMC) for next five years Including all parts, spares, accessories, all third party items e.g. cables, plastic items etc. and labour) for 6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> year (after expiry of five years' comprehensive warranty).
7. List of test parameter and their annual consumption are mentioned below (estimated consumption is given and it may vary, user department is not bound to give the supply order of estimated consumption). Participating firm should quote the rates (cost per test (CPT)) that are available in the quoted instrument. **Note:** CPT price would be included all consumables, controls, reagents, etc. (No extra items price would be considered. (The working sheet for calculating CPT price may also be prepared and uploaded in the PDF at price bid section for official purchase)
8. The quoted price (cost per test) will be valid for 10 years.
9. The annual load (test) would be 70,000 samples (approx.) for 4 machines and total load for 10 years would be 7,00,000 samples (approx.) for 4 equipment's.
10. The ranking will be prepared considering cost of equipment, CAMC (NPV value) and cost per test for 8,75,000 samples (Inclusive of GST) as total 05 units is to be procured.
11. If desired by the TSEC, Demonstration of quoted product would be mandatory at AIIMS, New Delhi premises. Only seven days' period will be given for preparation of demo unit and not further extension will be provided. All bidders must keep ready their quoted product for demonstration. None attending demo meeting/non-demonstration of quoted product, the bid will be summarily rejected.
12. Compliance Statement: The vendor must provide, in tabular form a comparative chart of the required technical specification and technical specification of the quoted product. The vendor must give the relevant page number and paragraph number, in their literature regarding that technical information in the technical bid. Merely stating "complies" or meets requirement" will lead to assumption that the quoted product does not have the required feature.
13. The L-1 bidder must submit copies of previous supply order placed by AIIMS, New Delhi or any other Govt./reputed Pvt. Hospitals/Organizations within one week of receiving the information for ascertaining the price reasonability of quote

d equipment/instruments.

14. The parent company should give the undertaking to provide the spares for 10 years, if required.
15. Original Manufacturer or their subsidiary or authorized dealer who is quoting should be present in India having selling experience of more than 02 years in government institutes/hospitals.
16. In no case the instrument should remain in non-working condition for more than 24 hours, beyond which a penalty as per the rules of the institute will be levied.
17. It will be responsibility of the vendor to submit proposal of CAMC at least 6 months before expiry of warranty of previous CAMC.
18. Price bid (with complete scope of supply, price break-up of all items), complete list of spare parts, accessories, consumables for quoted product must be uploaded in pdf at financial bid (space given in the price bid part of GeM Portal).
19. Bidders must quote rates of all spares, accessories, consumables (with break-up price of each item) separately (in PDF) and the quoted rates will remain valid for 10 years (warranty & CAMC period) for future purchases as and when required basis.
20. In case any item (spares, accessories, consumables) required to run the system and firm did not quote rates of those items in their price bid, the same mandatorily will be supplied by the firms at Free of Cost without any Price/conditions.

11. Price bid (with complete scope of supply, price break-up of all items), complete list of accessories, consumables for quoted product must be uploaded in pdf at financial bid (space given in the GeM Portal). The quoted rates will remain valid for 10 years (warranty & CAMC period).
12. Bidders must quote rates of all spares, accessories, consumables (with break-up price of each item) separately (in PDF) and the quoted rates will remain valid for 10 years (warranty & CAMC period) for future purchases as and when required basis.
13. In case any item (spares, accessories, consumables) required to run the system and firm did not quote rates of those items in their price bid, the same mandatorily will be supplied by the firms at Free of Cost without any condition.
14. Any modification/corrigendum in the bid conditions/specifications will be uploaded at 'Buyer specific ATC documents. Bidders may kindly see before uploading their bid.
15. As per para 2 of the PPP-MII order, 2017 (as amended on 16.09.2020 defines local content as 'Local content' mean of amount of value added in India which shall be the total value of the item procured (excluding net domestic indirect taxes) minus the value of imported content in the item (Including all Custom Duties) as a proportion of the total value in percent. **It is further clarified mathematically: "Local content = (Sale Price- Value of imported content) \* 100/Sale price"**. In case multiple items (X1, X2, X3) involved to supply from single bidder, the calculation of local content will be:  $Local\ content = ((Sale\ price\ of\ X1 - Value\ of\ imported\ content\ in\ X1) + (Sale\ price\ of\ X2 - Value\ of\ imported\ content\ in\ X2) + (Sale\ price\ of\ X3 - Value\ of\ imported\ content\ in\ X3)) * 100 / (Sale\ price\ of\ X1 + Sale\ price\ of\ X2 + sale\ price\ of\ X3)$ .
16. It is further clarified that bidders offering product/goods of other manufacturers and quoting bid against authorization, such bidders must submit EMD as stipulated in the bid documents. **EMD EXEMPTION:** The bidder seeking EMD exemption, must submit the valid supporting document for the relevant category as per GeM GTC with the bid. Under MSE category, only manufacturers for goods and Service Providers for Services are eligible for exemption from EMD. Traders are excluded from the purview of this Policy.
17. Keeping in view of above mentioned OM's/Guidelines/Rules of GOI, **the participated bidders are requested to provide the following information/documents to be eligible in the quoted tender:**
